Compete with local & schools statewide to earn the title of "Coolest School" by raising funds and promoting inclusion through Unified sports. The top fundraising school in each region wins a trophy, bragging rights, and other cool prizes, all while making a big impact for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

GETTING STARTED

- 1. Appoint a designated staff member as your team captain. This person will serve as the point of contact between the school and Special Olympics Illinois.
- 2. To be considered a Cool School Challenge, be featured on the website leaderboards, and qualify for regional and state contests, the Cool School Challenge must take place on your school's campus during the week, NO WEEKENDS. Any school that attends a traditional Polar Plunge site will be treated as a traditional Polar Plunge team.
- 3. Each participating school will have its own campaign fundraising page. This will allow the school to form teams within the individual campaign and help to build more fun, in-school competition (i.e. football team vs swim team)
- 4. To register for your own Cool School Challenge, please contact Debbie Kelly or your local Plunge Director and fill out the Cool School Plunge interest form. Once that step is completed and a date is confirmed by Special Olympics Illinois staff, your school's campaign will be set up and teams can be registered.
- 5. Each school must raise a minimum of \$3,000. This goal is easily achievable with just 30 participants—students, faculty, or community members—each raising \$100. Every plunge helps build a more inclusive school community and supports the mission of Special Olympics Illinois.
- 6. What Does "Plunging" Look Like? There are plenty of fun and creative ways for your school to take the plunge! Special Olympics Illinois can provide an inflatable pool (120"x72"x22" or a pool comparable to this size), or partner with your local fire department to use a portable tank or even a fire hose. We've seen everything from a water trough, water balloon fights and buckets of cold water poured over students. Plunging should be flexible, accessible and as imaginative as you want it to be!
- 7. The school that raises the most money in their region will win the regional plunge trophy and a Dunkin' party for their top fundraising team. Statewide, schools will compete for a school-wide Dunkin' party and Grand Cool School Plunge trophy. Track your school's progress on the Cool School Challenge page at plungeillinois.com.

The Cool School Challenge is also a fun and impactful team-building experience that teaches students the value of inclusion and responsibility of citizenship. Best of all, it directly benefits the athletes of Special Olympics Illinois.

INCENTIVES

Outside of helping to support life-changing programming for the Special Olympics Illinois athletes, participants in your Cool School Challenge will also be rewarded with SWAG!
